## John Lesson Six

**Read John 5.**

1. Give the time and setting of the story that is told in John 5.

2. Why was there a multitude of sick, blind and lame people in this scene?

3. Which person caught Jesus' attention on this day?

4. Did Jesus promise this man anything?

5. Why was the man able to rise and walk?

6. Why did Jesus choose the Sabbath on which to heal this man?

7. What is implied by Jesus' statement, "Sin no more, lest a worse thing come upon you?"

8. What are the "signs" or "works" (miracles) that Jesus has done so far in this gospel?

9. There are an equal number of "words" (messages) of Jesus as there are "works" of Jesus at this point in John's gospel. List the "words". I have given the first as an example.

1. John 2:13-22.....At the cleansing of the temple. Jesus prophesied concerning his death and resurrection.

10. Give two reasons why the Jews (Jewish leaders) have now determined to kill Jesus?

11. Give phrases from verses 19-22 concerning elements of Jesus' relationship to His Father?

12. What reasons does Jesus give for all to honor the Son?

13. Which phrase in John 5:24 indicates that we are "spiritually dead" until we receive eternal life from Jesus Christ?

14. What must a person's response be to Jesus that he receive everlasting life? (See also John 3:16)

15. What does it mean that a person "shall not come into judgment?"

16. (Challenge question) Compare verse 25 and 28. What is the time period of each? Who will hear the voice of Jesus in verse 25? In verse 28? What is the result of hearing the voice of the Son of God in each instance?

17. Verse 22 says that the Father "has committed all judgment to the Son." Is the Father involved in this judgment? If so, how?

18. In chapter one of John, we read of the witness of John the Baptist, Andrew, Philip, and Nathanael. What are four valid witnesses of Christ in this fifth chapter of John?

19. Why was Jesus' witness of Himself invalid? See John 8:14, Deuteronomy 17:6 and 19:15.

20. What was Christ claiming for which He needed witnesses?

21. What did Jesus have to say concerning why they did not believe on Him?

22. (Challenge question) Give some examples of Moses writing about Jesus. Moses wrote Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers and Deuteronomy.
