John Lesson Ten

Read John 8:1-11, Leviticus 20:10

1. What two things did Jesus do in response to the Pharisees and scribes who brought the adulterous woman before Him and asked Him what He thought should be done about it?

2. What do you think Jesus may have written in the dirt? (Psalm 90:8)

3. Why did Jesus not condemn her?

Read John 8:12-20

4. In chapter six Jesus said, "I am the Bread of Life." Now what does Jesus say that He is?

5. Who is said to be light in the following verses?

Psalm 27:1

Isaiah 60:19

I John 1:5

6. This is still during the Feast of Tabernacles as in chapter seven. The Jews refer to this festival as "the time of our joy." It was a celebration of how the Lord brought them out of the land of Egypt and how they lived in tents or booths during those years. What was Jesus reminding them of by saying that He was the "light of the world?" (See Exodus 13:21) What was He declaring about Himself?

7. What part of the tabernacle represents that Christ is the light of the world? (Leviticus 25:31-40) What part of the tabernacle represents Christ as the Bread of Life? (Leviticus 25:23-30)

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Read 1 John chapters 1 and 2.

8. John 8:12 tells who shall "walk in darkness" and 1 John 1:7 tells us we should "walk in the light." From these passages list the things which show whether one is walking in darkness or in the light.

Darkness	Light

9. What three reasons did Jesus answer to validate His witness after the Pharisees challenged Jesus and said that His witness was not true?

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10. Where was Jesus when He was teaching these things?

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11. Is it possible to know God the Father without knowing Jesus? (See also 1 John 2:23, John 14:6 and Acts 4:12 and Romans 1:16)

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Read John 8:21-30

12. What is Jesus announcing by saying, "Where I go, you cannot come?"

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13. What is the result of not believing that Jesus is God?

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14. What did Jesus tell them concerning His origin?

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15. In verses 24, 28, and 58, Jesus declares that He is "I AM." (The *He* is italicized in verses 24 and 28 indicating that it was added and not part of the original manuscript.) Explain what the Pharisees understood this to mean. (See Exodus 3:13-14

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16. (Challenge Question) Show ways in which Jehovah of the Old Testament and Jesus of the New Testament share the same qualities. Give references for each. Are they the same person?

Read John 31-59

17. What kind of freedom was Jesus speaking of in verse 32?

18. Who did the Pharisees claim as their father? Who did Jesus say was their father?

19. How did the Pharisees show themselves to not be the children of Abraham or children of God?

20. Because the Jews did not like hearing what Jesus had to say and because they had no real answer they resorted to insulting Him. What did they call Jesus?

21. What did Jesus promise to those who "keeps My word?"

22. (Challenge Question) Did Abraham ever see Jesus?
